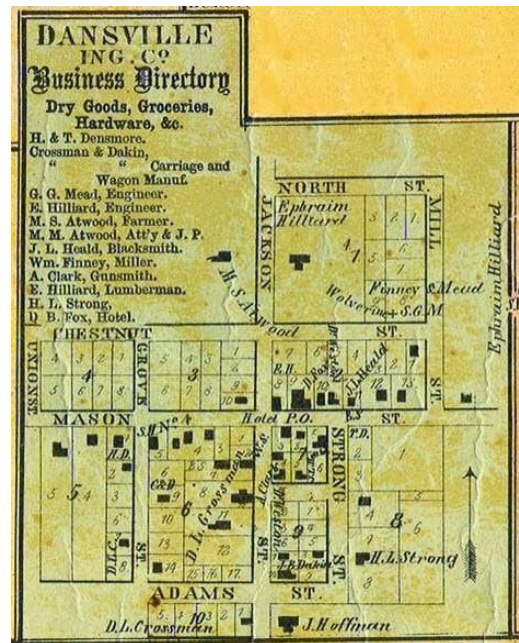
# Chance to win a prize!

## Dansville, 160 years ago

Imagine a trip back in time to Dansville even before the Civil War. # Help capture the lost faces of Dansville Schools



The first high school graduate of Dansville Schools was Mina Rice in 1883. With 137 years of graduations one can imagine there is a lot of history that has passed through the halls throughout the years. The society is attempting to put together a complete collection of not only the names of those graduates, but the photos as well. All of the years from 1925 to present have been accounted for in the class composites that have hung on the walls in the school. The struggle has been from 1883 - 1924. In total only five graduation photos have been uncovered, with one of them being a copy from a book.

The above copy is from the class of 1921. The original image was allowed to be scanned and a digital donation was given to the society by one of our members. The nice part about this is that member was able to keep their family photo, but share an invaluable piece of Dansville history with not only the society, but Dansville as a whole.

Our hope in sharing this image and story with all of you is that we are able to find some of these photos that have been lost to time and put them together in one collection.
